

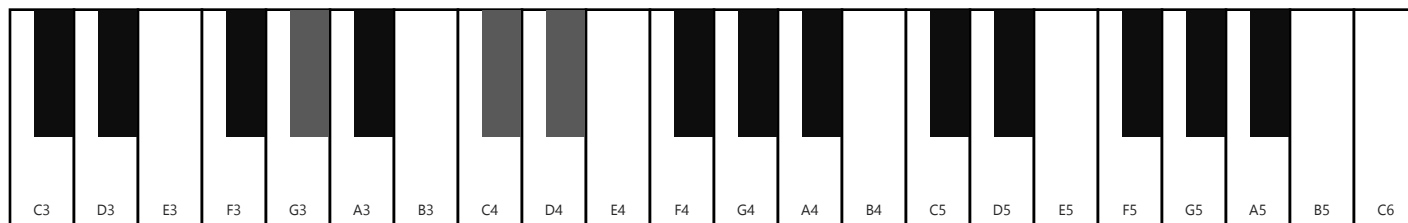
A $\flat$ Suspended 4th (A $\flat$ sus4)

Notes: A $\flat$ – D $\flat$ – E $\flat$ Formula: 1–4–5

Exact pitch examples. Read left to right from the lowest written note.

Root position · A $\flat$ sus4

Bass: A $\flat$ 3



Selected pitches: A $\flat$ 3 · D $\flat$ 4 · E $\flat$ 4

First inversion · A $\flat$ sus4/D $\flat$

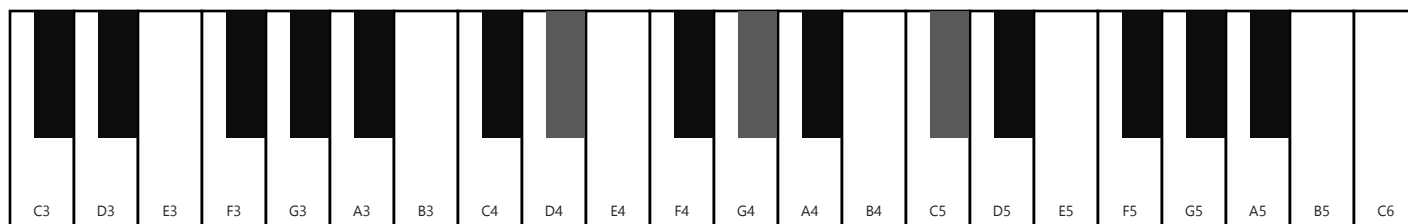
Bass: D $\flat$ 4



Selected pitches: D $\flat$ 4 · E $\flat$ 4 · A $\flat$ 4

Second inversion · A $\flat$ sus4/E $\flat$

Bass: E $\flat$ 4



Selected pitches: E $\flat$ 4 · A $\flat$ 4 · D $\flat$ 5

Shading marks sounding piano keys. Written names can be enharmonic equivalents of those keys.

Octave numbers identify register, not fingers. No fingering is assigned.

Each position keeps the same three chord tones and changes the lowest chord tone.

Keyboard window: C3–C6. Written spelling is preserved in notes, symbols and bass labels.
